- Its open source
- Uses ISO standard file format (ODF)
- Available in over 70 languages
- Cross-platform
- Support available



 - No printing
 - No copying
- No editing



Excel vs. Calc


- No more row limitation 65536 rows!
- Complex statistical functions might be unavailable
- Which is correct?
 - = IF(C3 > 0, D1+D2, D1-D2)
 - = IF(C3 > 0; D1+D2; D1-D2) < Calc

This is one of the most common differences that will affect you. Take note of the ";" instead of the ","!



Excel vs. Calc

- DataPilot (instead of the Pivot Table)
 - Can do statistical analysis on data independent of the sheet/cells (spreadsheet) but also data sources!





Features of confusion

- When apply filters, my totals change?
 - SUBTOTAL(range): adjust totals based on filter

Access vs. Base

- File incompatibility
- All is not lost
 - Use the MySQL Migration Toolkit
 - Convert Access to MySQL (locally running, or on a server)
 - Manipulate data using Base, connecting to **MySQL**
- Benefits are a plenty web access to your DB!

Base displays and edits the migrated Access database. directly to MySOL.







Dictionaries/thesaurus are available online, or via tools that connect to the online version (just like in Microsoft Office), but these are sub-optimal.


Grammar checker is being integrated (October 2006) as it was a Google Summer of Code project that turned into success.

File interoperability with MS Office isn't 100%, but no package can aim to do so, in theory, not even Office:Mac and Office 2003 for instance. File filters like the WordPerfect filter do exist, but are not integrated.

VBA Macros aren't touched. The ability to edit them exists. The ability to run them to a certain extent exists via Novell's OOo.





The power of PDF



- All applications have the export to PDF functionality
- Advanced options are available as well
 - No printing
 - No copying
- No editing

Get the Stylist via hitting the F11 key

Format Paintbrush is used to copy a style (manually created) and apply it to other parts of the text.

Format Paintbrush = Format Painter in Word



Can also be created via the toolbar quickly (Ctrl+F12 is another)

Excel vs. Calc

- No more row limitation 65536 rows!
- Complex statistical functions might be unavailable
- Which is correct?
 - = IF(C3 > 0, D1+D2, D1-D2) < Excel
 - = IF(C3 > 0; D1+D2; D1-D2) < Calc

This is one of the most common differences that will affect you. Take note of the ";" instead of the ","!

If with all their resources they can't do it right, I have to say that I'm concerned about a package (Calc) put together mostly by volunteer programmers

(not statisticians and not numerical analysts, I would presume). This is not to

slam those people, but statistics is no place for amateurs, even those copying

formulas out of a book.

I would suggest that all statistical functions in Calc be vetted by an computer-experienced statistician, who will run extensive tests and report on

weak areas. All functions, especially the statistical functions, should also be


examined by someone experienced in numerical computing. At the very, very least,

the developers need to find a large suite of tests to thoroughly




